PNH	PCPTY	<p><b>Discover Phnom Penh- Full Day</b>            After meeting your guide at your hotel at 8am this morning you will go on a discover tour of Cambodia's Capital and, gain some insight into its recent dark history with a visit to the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum. Taken over by the Khmer Rouge, this former high school was converted into a detention and torture center known as 'S-21'. It can be a little grim, but an important visit that allows one to dig below the surface and understand present day Cambodia better. Onward to a lighter side of Cambodia at the Russian Market (so called because a large number of Russian Expats who shopped here in the 1980's) it is a great experience and the best place in the city for wood and stone carvings, jewelry, clothes and Cambodian silk souvenirs. We can't vouch for the authenticity of the 'labelled' products. but it is great fun.            A pleasant break for lunch at local restaurant is our next stop with a Khmer menu.            In the afternoon Wrap up the tour with a visit to the hilltop Wat Phnom temple, the founding place of the city. Then continue to the Royal Palace, followed by the Silver Pagoda, named for the over 5,000 heavy silver tiles that cover its floors. Its original name is Wat Prakeo, meaning Temple of the Emerald Buddha; the temple is known for its collection of Buddhas in gold, silver, crystal, and bronze. 		<p>After breakfast at your hotel your guide will meet you in the lobby at 8am, or after lunch at 2pm..for the short transfer to the island.</p> <p>As the name might suggest the island is home to a silk weaving village and silk center, where you can see how the whole silk production process works from beginning to end. It really is quite fascinating and probably more skilled and labour intensive than you might first imagine, from mulberry-chomping silkworms in golden cocoons through to the complex manual loom weaving process. The beautifully constructed houses under which weavers patiently weave at their looms are worth a tour as they turn out simple but finely crafted silks scarves and skirts, which can be purchased at the village shop. Continuing along through the village, we will arrive the lovely Koh Dach Pagoda painted in bright yellow, which is simply perfect against a blue sky. Some of the island’s Water Festival boats are kept here, however they look so frail, it’s hard to imagine that more than 1,000 years ago they were originally designed for battle.</p> <p><b>4hrs Duration</b></p>	<p>Entrance ticket Lunch.</p>

The swing on the green of the fairways is typically generous but the bunkering style is impressively bold and the greens have plenty of subtle undulations rewarding and encouraging a variety of approach shots. REP	PTOMVA	<p><b>Angkor Highlights</b>            It an 8:00am start this morning as you embark on a journey through the history of Angkor. First stop is the South Gate (with its huge statues depicting the churning of the ocean of milk), the ancient capital of Angkor Thom in the late 12th century then onwards to Bayon temple which is unique for its 54 towers decorated with over 200 smiling faces of Avolokitesvara, Baphuon is like an artificial mountain which recently re-opened after years of restoration, the Royal Enclosure, the Elephants Terrace and the Terrace of the Leper King. Then continue to the popular temple of Ta Prohm which is the modern name of the temple at Angkor, built in the Bayon style largely in the late 12th and early 13th centuries, but probably more famous for being the location where they filmed the Tomb Raider movie.            12:00 Enjoy lunch at local restaurant. At approximately midday you will be transferred back to your hotel for a short break and refresh after lunch            At 14:30pm start the 'main event' the magnificent Angkor Wat Temple. Built during the reign of King Suryavarman II in the early 12th century, Angkor Wat was constructed to represent Mount Meru, the Hindu/Buddhist home of the gods. Inside the temple, the walls are covered with stone carvings, bas - reliefs. It is quite breathtaking... so take your time for photographs and viewings. In afternoon your excursion continues to the War Museum where you will be able to see war machines like the T-54 tank, the MiG-19 jet fighter aircraft, the Mi-8 helicopter and the field artillery 85-mm D-44 gun.</p> <p>As a complete change of pace, you will then end the tour at the Angkor Silk Farm. A beautiful site housing many silk workshops employing locals which is located 16Km from Siem Reap. An outstanding exhibition center showing the entire silk processes and end product. You will then return to your hotel by transfer.</p> <p><b>8hrs Duration</b></p>				
REP	PBTSTL	<p><b>Banteay Srei – Tonle Sap</b></p> <p>An 8:00am pick up in your hotel lobby marks the start of this wonderful day tour showing the two sides of these areas. Firstly visit the Banteay Samre which is a Large, comparatively flat temple displaying distinctively Angkor Wat-style architecture and artistry. The temple underwent extensive restoration this century by archaeologists using the anastylosis method. Banteay Samre was constructed around the same time as Angkor Wat. Following this we go to celebrated Banteay Srei, also one of the most beautiful temples it was constructed in 967 AD by Jayavarman V's guru. Banteay Srei is built largely of red sandstone, a medium that lends itself to the elaborate decorative wall carvings which can still be seen today. Now we have time for you to enjoy a 'temple break' for a traditional Khmer lunch at local restaurant.</p> <p>This afternoon you will visit Tonle Sap Lake to discover different aspects of the floating village activities: crocodile farming, fish raising, fishing operation preparation, traditional medicine, boat shops, spirit houses, floating schools, etc. The last stop of the day is The Old Market and it really is the oldest Khmer market in Siem Reap, where locals shop for fresh produce and household items in the early morning. REP	PKUROL	<p><b>Phnom Kulen &amp; The Roluos Temples</b></p> <p>Today begins with a pick up at 8:00am in your hotel lobby. The journey to our first destination will take approximately 2 hours through rural Cambodia, but you will see it is worth the journey when you arrive at – Phnom Kulen or Kulen Mountain, which means “Mountain of Lychees”. It is considered by Khmers to be the most sacred mountain in Cambodia and serves as a place of pilgrimage on weekends and special occasions. On the top of the mountain here you will see the massive reclining Buddha. The Buddha statue is made of sandstone and is one of the biggest of its kind in Cambodia. Also, the views from this vantage point will not disappoint as you cast an eye over Cambodia’s lush forests and jungles. Another site here is the ‘River of A Thousand Lingas’, which features carvings of sacred lingas in sandstone formations on the river bed and banks. A linga is a stylized image of a phallus representing the essence of the God Shiva. The carvings are visible even when the water is at its lowest level. The waterfalls of Phnom Kulen are also must-see sight. After climbing up to the mountain and exploring around, the waterfalls are a perfect spot to cool off. Plunge into the cold refreshing water that flows through the falls and do not miss this great photo opportunity as the falls are a perfect backdrop. Here you will enjoy a picnic lunch on the mountains – just like the locals do.</p> <p>On the way back you visit the Roluos group (PREAH KO and BAKONG Temple), a modern small town and an archeological site which was once the seat of Hariharalaya, first capital of the Khmer Empire north of Tonle Sap. Next you will visit another ancient Hindu temple call KOH KEI Temple, it has a unique pyramidal shape &amp; the panoramic views from the top make the climb well worth it. The Temple of Preah Vihear, is an architectural complex of a series of sanctuaries linked by a system of pavements and staircases on an 800metre long axis, it is an outstanding masterpiece of Khmer architecture, in terms of plan, decoration and relationship to the spectacular landscape environment. An ancient Hindu temple built during the period of the Khmer Empire on the Dângrêk Mountains, the history of the complex can be traced to the 9th century, when the hermitage was founded. This site is particularly well preserved, mainly due to its remote location in the Preah Vihear province.
